# Overview/key issues

- With the crisis evolving rapidly at different stages globally, government authorities continue to impose immigration-related measures to limit the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic and protect the health and safety of individuals in and outside of their jurisdictions.
- Measures to stem the spread of COVID-19 include the following:
  - Entry restrictions and heightened admission criteria for certain populations (including prohibitions on entry from high-risk locations)
  - Mandatory “stay-home notices” and quarantine orders for newly admitted citizens, residents and visitors (whether in state facilities, hotels or private residences)
  - Temporary suspension (and in some cases, permanent cancelation) of existing (valid) visas issued prior to COVID-19 and suspension of issuance of new visas
  - Introduction of heightened eligibility criteria and application requirements where visas are being issued (including suspension of visa waiver agreements and enhanced document requirements for new applications)
- Some governments are announcing flexible policies to prevent temporary residents who are unable to travel from becoming overstayers under immigration laws, and enabling virtual right to work checking.

# Next steps

## Key immigration risk focus areas include:

- Business continuity remains a key risk with globally mobile workforce grounded
- Application/visa processing center closures may mean that moves either have to be put on hold or withdrawn
- Multiple layers of restrictions impact decisions around globally mobile workforces
- Loss of physical presence is impacting right to work checking
- Employees who are abroad are at risk of technically overstaying beyond their permitted period of stay
- Stranded/separated workforces and family members
- Remote workers are unable to carry out productive work

## Preparing for what comes next:

- Where lockdowns are not yet in force, companies should prepare guidelines/policies for globally mobile employees, including exit strategies for travelers stuck abroad (to go into effect when travel restrictions start to lift)
- Companies should become informed on flexible government policies and confirm their ability to continue to file/submit applications for processing to avoid a backlog when COVID-19 related restrictions are lifted
- Companies should prioritize moves that are critical to ensure the health and safety of employees, as well as those that are critical to business continuity
- Companies should consider personal/unique circumstances of individuals and any heightened risk factors
- Companies should assess risks and potential impacts to determine response measures and priorities

- ▶ The issuance of new entry visas has been suspended until the reopening of the Algerian borders to foreigners.

New entrants will be tested on their seventh day in Angola, and issued a discharge certificate if they test negative. They will no longer be required to quarantine once they receive their discharge certificates.</li></ul>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▶ New entrants are required to take a reverse transmission polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) COVID-19 test and test negative for COVID-19 within 72 hours of their intended travel.</li></ul>	



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<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▶ International flights will not be permitted to land in Argentina before 11 October 2020, except for humanitarian reasons, and the repatriation of nationals and residents to Argentina.</li><li>▶ Non-residents will not be permitted to enter until 11 October 2020 (extended from 20 September 2020).</li><li>▶ Borders will be opened in a gradual, planned and safe manner to ensure the safe return of Argentinians abroad.</li><li>▶ Eight land border crossings will open between 8 am and 4 pm, allowing 500 people to enter daily.</li><li>▶ Ezeiza International Airport is the only airport open to receive authorized international flights. - ▶ Austrian citizens, EU/EEA citizens, Swiss citizens and residents of Austria may enter Austria from the following locations without proving that they tested negative for COVID-19 or undergoing a quarantine: Andorra, Belgium, Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Ireland, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Monaco, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, San Marino, Switzerland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain (only Canary Island), Czech Republic, Hungary, Vatican City, Great Britain and Cyprus. This applies to travel by land and air, and requires travelers to demonstrate that they have not been in a jurisdiction other than Austria or the jurisdictions in the preceding list in the 14 days preceding their entry to Austria.
- ▶ Austrian citizens, EU/EEA citizens, Swiss citizens and residents of Austria entering Austria from any of the following locations must carry a health certificate, i.e. a negative polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test issued within 72 hours prior to travel) confirming that they tested negative for COVID-19.

- ▶ Alternatively, they must take a PCR test within 48 hours of arrival (if they test negative, then their quarantine will end): Egypt, Albania, Bangladesh, Belarus, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Brazil, Bulgaria, Chile, Ecuador, India, Indonesia, Iran, Kosovo, Croatia, Mexico, Moldova, Montenegro, Nigeria, North Macedonia, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Portugal, Province of Hubei (China), Romania, Russia, Sweden, Senegal, Serbia, Spain (except Canary Island), South-Africa, Turkey, Ukraine and United States of America.
- ▶ Travelers who do not fall within the categories listed above must carry a negative PCR health certificate issued within 72 hours of their proposed entry. Otherwise, they must commit to a 10-day quarantine (which may end early if they test for COVID-19 upon arrival and receive a negative test result in less than 10 days).

If the initial test comes back positive, they will be required to undergo quarantine measures.</li> <li>▶ New entrants will need to take a second COVID-19 test on their 10th day in Bahrain (if their trip will last 10 days or longer). - ▶ Entry restrictions remain in place in Belgium. External (Schengen) borders remain closed to foreigners for all non-essential travel. This restriction does not apply to those in possession of a valid residence permit or long-stay visa. Belgium has now expanded the definition of essential travel to include certain short-term assignments (lasting less than 90 days) and travel by self-employed workers. Internal borders (within the EU/Schengen Area) have been reopened to residents of the EU, the United Kingdom, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Iceland and Norway.

- ▶ Quarantine/self isolation rules remain in place, but have recently eased. Anyone arriving from a non-EU/EEA jurisdiction, or from a EU/EEA jurisdiction marked as high risk (red zone), will need to self-isolate for seven days and take a COVID-19 test on their fifth day of isolation.
- ▶ Further to the above, anyone who shows symptoms of COVID-19 or who has been in close contact with someone who tested positive, will need to follow the same quarantine and testing rules as new entrants arriving from high-risk jurisdictions.
