Draft Amendments in the Code of Civil Procedure and Code of Administrative Procedure

Supreme Court Claim Form

Grounds for admissibility of the case on merits

- Under the draft amendments, a Supreme Court Claim shall comply with the for the claim adopted by the Council of Justice
- Under the draft Amendments, the following grounds are to be added in the Civil and Administrative Procedure Codes for the Supreme Court to admit the case for examination on merits:
 - There is no Supreme Court decision on the issue;
 - It is likely that the Supreme Court will decide the case differently than previous precedents;
 - The Appeals court violated substantive norms which may have effected the outcome of the case
 - Appeals Court decision is in conflict with the European Convention for the Protection of Human rights and Fundamental Freedoms and ECHR case law.

Regulatory Fees for use of natural resources

- The amendments provide for fees and payment rules for use of natural resources, oil refining, natural gas processing and transportation. Under the existing law, the fees and payment rules are provided under the respective regulations of National Environmental Agency and Gas Agency.
